Using the Business Information Server it is possible to view summary and detailed tank data, amend manual data, view and schedule reports and view historical trend data.

 The Business Information Server client is not intended to be used as a substitute for an operator client station.

#### 2.2.2 Intended use of Tankvision Professional NXA85 software

Tankvision Professional is specifically designed for operators of bulk storage facilities, marketing terminals, refineries and pipelines. It is designed to handle all the data acquisition, supervisory control and monitoring required in a single fully integrated solution.

Tankvision Professional integrates all major types of tank measurement instruments into one system.

All measured and calculated tank parameters are accessible to your tank farm and terminal operators as well as to connected host systems.

Multi-user operation is provided by the inbuilt Web Server offering the opportunity to access data at any connected location (local/remote) e.g. for administrative and accounting purposes.

### 2.3 IT security

A warranty on our part can only be provided if the software application is installed and used as specified in the operating manual. The software application contains safety mechanisms to protect it against inadvertent changes to the software settings.

IT security measures that are in accordance with the operator's safety and security standards and designed to additionally protect the software application and the transfer of data must be implemented by the operator.

### 3 Product description

This version of Tankvision Professional includes the Business Information Server web client. The Business Information Server functionality is primarily aimed at supporting functions and should not be viewed as a substitute for an operator station. Using the Business Information Server it is possible to view summary and detailed tank data, amend manual data, view and schedule reports and view historical trend data.




The Business Information Server client is not intended to be used as a substitute for an operator client station.

## 4 Incoming acceptance and product identification

### 4.1 Incoming acceptance

On receipt of the delivery:

1. Check the packaging for damage.
  - ↳ Report all damage immediately to the manufacturer.  
Do not install damaged components.
2. Check the scope of delivery using the delivery note.
3. Compare the data on the nameplate with the order specifications on the delivery note.
4. Check the technical documentation and all other necessary documents, e.g. certificates, to ensure they are complete.

 If one of the conditions is not satisfied, contact the manufacturer.

### 4.2 Product identification

The following options are available for identification of the software:

- Nameplate specifications
- Order code with breakdown of the software features on the delivery note

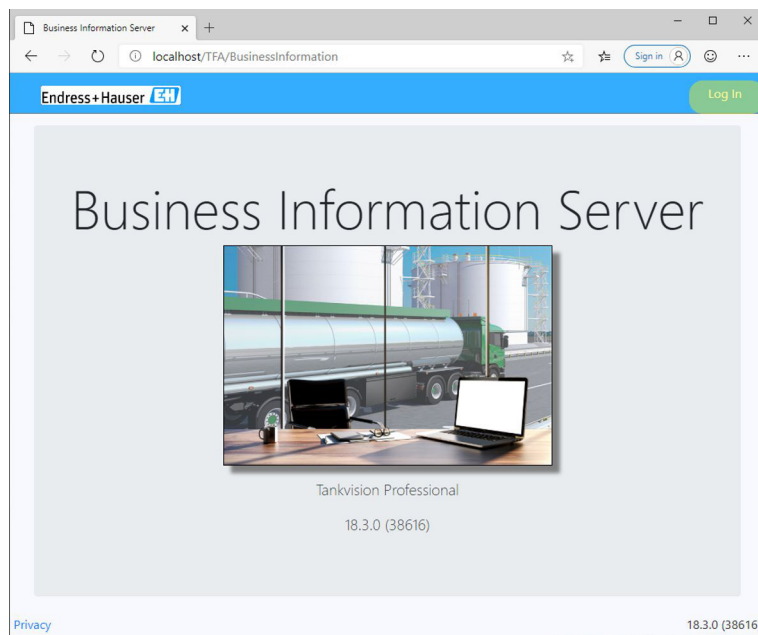

## 5 User interface

### 5.1 First Use

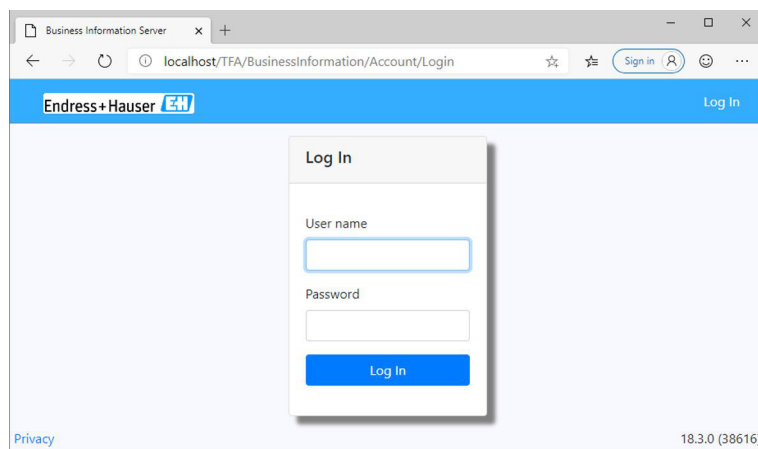
The Business Information Server is launched by opening a browser session and then navigating to the machine on which Tankvision Professional is installed. For example, if the name of the machine is TankGauging, then the Business Information Server client can be accessed by typing `http://TankGauging:8085` in the address box of the browser. This will automatically be redirected to the Business Information Server home page (`http://TankGauging:8085/TFA/BusinessInformation`).

To use any functionality of the Business Information Server it is necessary to log in. This is achieved by clicking on the **Log In** link at the top right corner of the page:



1 Home Page

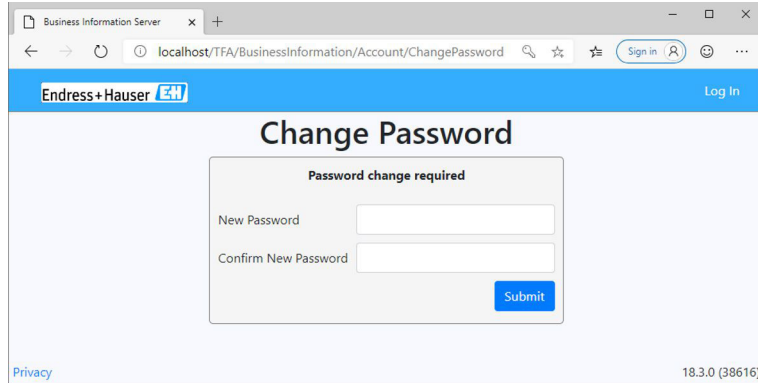
The user will then be prompted to enter their user name and password:

If the Business Information Server has not been previously run the user name will be Administrator and the password will be password. Note that the password is case-sensitive and must be entered with all lower-case characters.

Upon successful log in, the user will be prompted to change the password for the administrator user:



3 Change Password Page

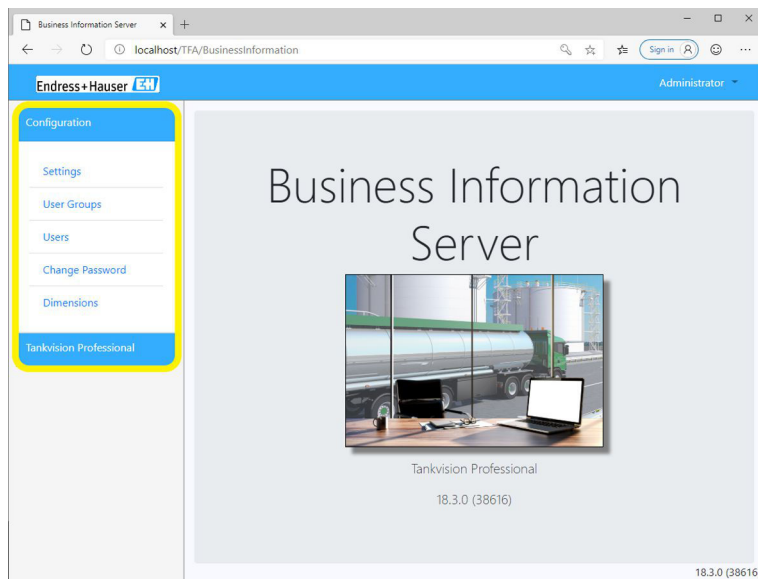
The new password must:

- Be at least 6 characters in length
- Contain at least one non-alphanumeric character
- Contain at least one number
- Contain at least one uppercase character

These restrictions can be amended later in the **System Settings** page → 12.

## 5.2 Navigation

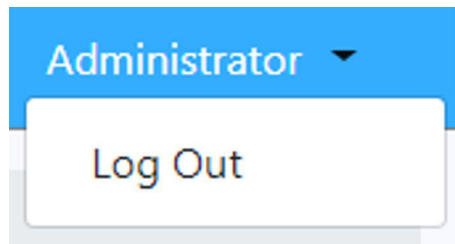
The functionality of the Business Information Server is navigated using the navigation bar on the left side of the page:

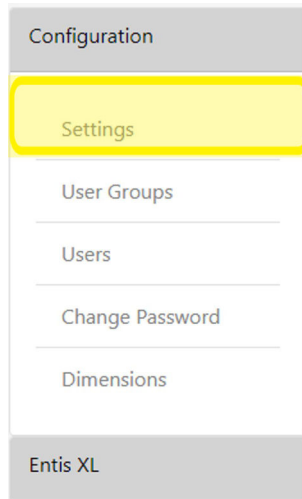

**General**

The General section of the settings simply displays the date the settings were last modified and allows the language for the Business Information Server to be selected.

 The selected language will be used for all Business Information Server clients

## Authentication

The Authentication section of the settings allows the authentication options to be modified.

### ■ Sliding Expiration

This setting indicates whether sliding expiration is enabled. If it is ticked, then the time until the user is automatically logged out is reset each time authentication is performed (generally when the user navigates to another page). If it is left unticked, then the user is automatically logged out at the specified interval after they logged in.

### ■ Login Timer Timeout

The interval after which the user is to be automatically logged out, see notes on **Sliding Expiration** above.

### ■ Max Failed Access Attempts

This setting is used to define how many times a user is able to try unsuccessfully to log in before they are locked out of the system.

### ■ Lockout Timespan

This setting is used to set the length of time that a user is unable to attempt to log in after they have been locked out of the system.

## Password Options

The Password Options section of the settings allows the strength of user passwords to be enforced.

### ■ Minimum Length

The minimum length permitted for a password.

### ■ Unique Characters

The number of unique characters required in a password

### ■ Require Lowercase

Indicates whether a password must contain one or more lower-case characters.

### ■ Require Uppercase

Indicates whether a password must contain one or more upper-case characters.

### ■ Require Digit

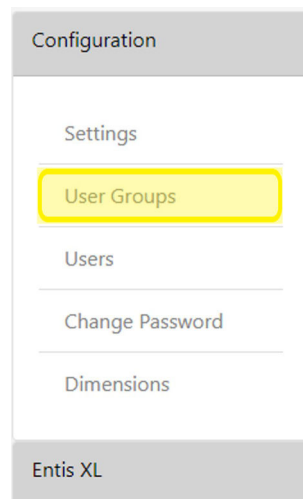
Indicates whether a password must contain one or more digits.

### ■ Require Non-Alphanumeric

Indicates whether a password must contain one or more characters that is neither a number nor a letter.

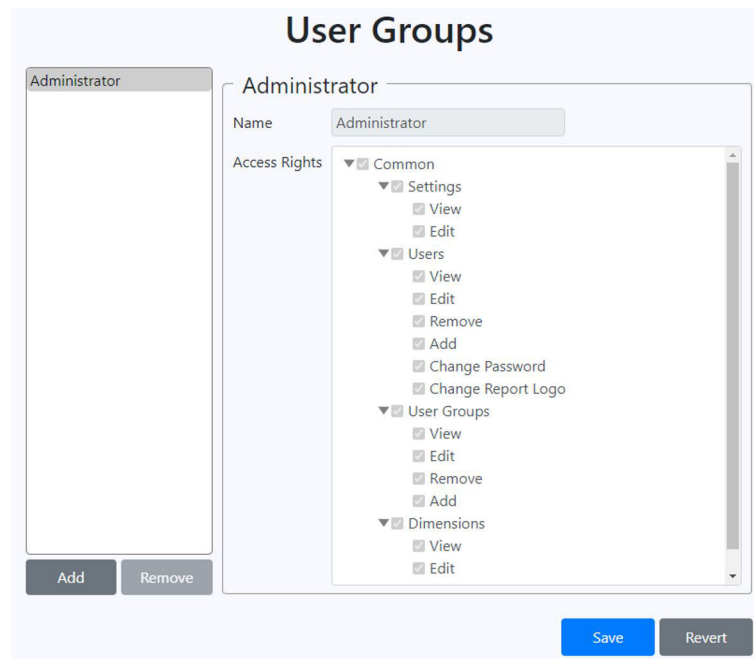

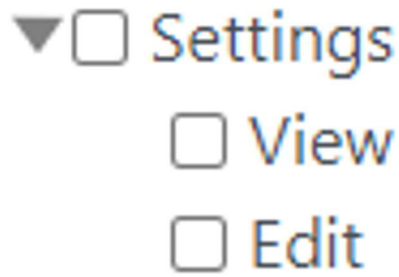

If an access right has a ► symbol next to it, it indicates that the item can be expanded to show child access rights by clicking on the symbol.

If an access right has a ▼ symbol next to it, it indicates that the item can be collapsed to hide the child access rights by clicking on the symbol.

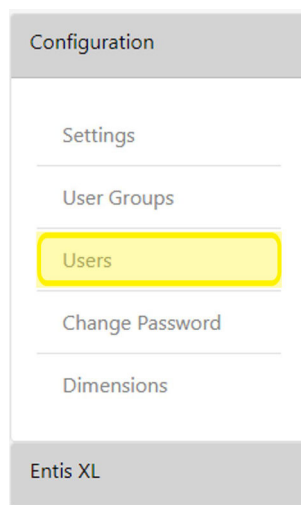
If an access right is ticked, it indicates that members of the user group will have access to that area of functionality. Conversely, if the access right is not ticked, it indicates that members of the user group are prohibited from that area of functionality. Click on either the box or the name of the access right to toggle permissions. If an access right has child access rights, the new permission will be cascaded down to all children. For example, to grant a user both View and Edit access rights for settings it is only necessary to click on the Settings entry:

#### ▪ Name

The name of the user. This cannot be edited for the Administrator user.

#### ▪ Domain User

Indicates whether the user is associated with a domain and should be authenticated using network credentials rather than a Business Information Server specific password. This option is not available for the Administrator user.

#### ▪ Domain

This field is only visible when the Domain User option has been ticked. It is used to enter the domain against which the user is to be authenticated.

#### ▪ Disable

Indicates if a user is to be disabled to prevent them logging in. This option is not available for the Administrator user.

#### ▪ User Group

The user group to which the user belongs.

#### ▪ Limit Concurrent Logins

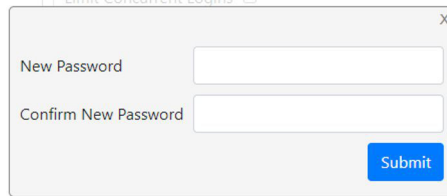
Indicates if the user is only allowed to have a limited number of concurrent logins.

#### ▪ Max Concurrent Logins

This field is only visible when the Limit Concurrent Logins has been ticked. It is used to set the maximum number of stations at which the user is allowed to log into the Business Information Server concurrently.

#### ▪ Password Reset

This option is not available for domain users. Clicking this button displays the reset password popup:

- ▶ To reset the password for the currently selected user, enter the new password and then click **Submit**.

The change will not take place until **Save** is clicked on the users page.

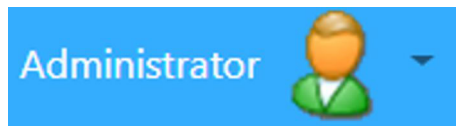
- ▶ To abandon the password reset, click away from the popup.

- **Force Password Change**

Indicates that the user will be required to change their password the next time that they log on to the Business Information Server.

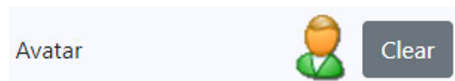
- **Avatar**

Click the Add button to add an avatar to the user. A file dialog will be displayed to allow selection of the avatar to be used. This avatar will be displayed alongside the user name when a user is logged in:

The avatar can be changed by clicking on it. This will display a file dialog to allow selection of the replacement avatar to be used. To remove the avatar entirely, click the **Clear** button.

- **Restrict Tanks**

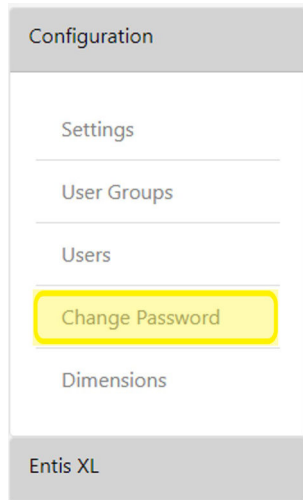
Indicates if a user is only allowed access to a limited set of tanks.

- **Static Tank Group**

This field is only available when the Restrict Tanks option has been selected. It is used to select the static tank group which contains the tanks to which the user should have access.

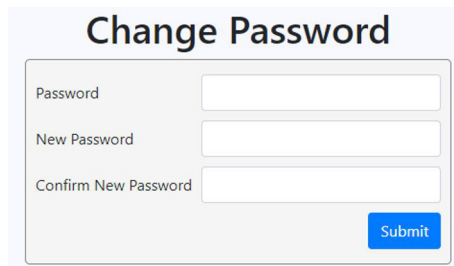

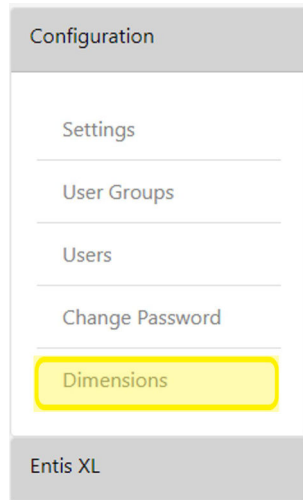

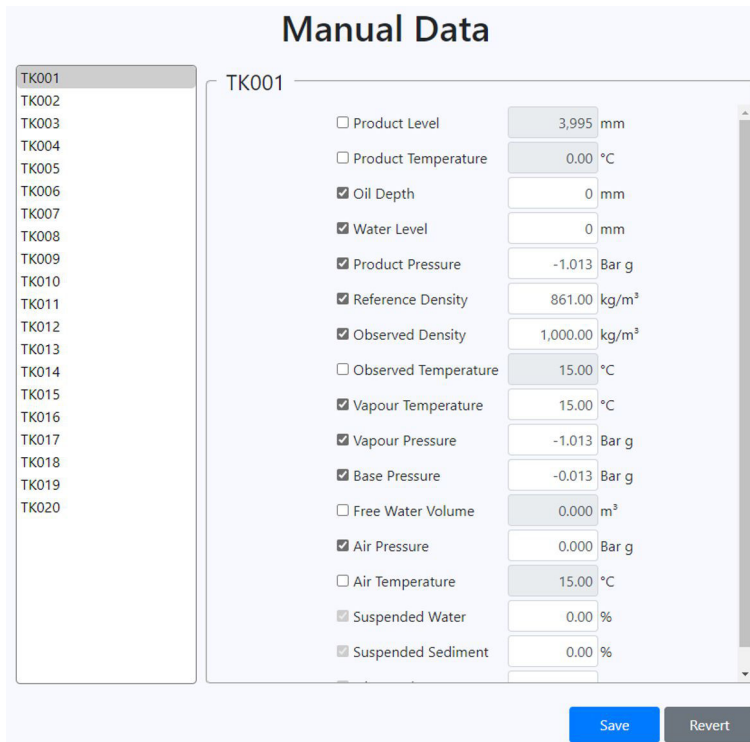

A list of available tanks is displayed on the left side of the page. If the currently logged-in user only has access to a restricted set of tanks (see User Configuration), then only the tanks from their static tank group will be displayed. Otherwise all tanks will be displayed.

When a tank is selected, the current manual data for that tank is displayed on the right hand side of the page. The manual data fields that are available to be viewed can be restricted by modifying the access rights of the user group that the user belongs to:

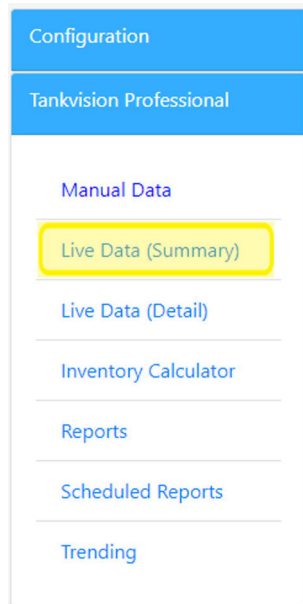
The box alongside the field name indicates whether the field is currently in manual mode. If the box is ticked, then the field is in manual mode. To toggle manual mode, click on the box.

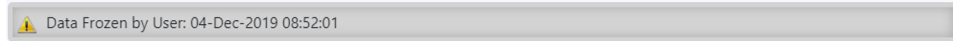

If the currently logged in user only has access to a restricted set of tanks (see User Configuration), then only the tanks from their static tank group will be displayed. Otherwise all tanks will be displayed.

### 7.2.1 Freezing Data

It is possible to **freeze** the data update so that a snapshot of the tank data can be viewed.

To freeze the data click on the **Freeze/Unfreeze** button  above the list of tanks. The data displayed will no longer be updated, and a warning will be displayed in the status bar:

To unfreeze the data, click the **Freeze/Unfreeze** button again. Whilst the data is frozen the appearance of the button will change .

## 7.2.2 Export Data

To export the current data click on the **Export Data** button . A popup will be displayed allowing the format of the export to be changed:

26 *Export Data*

- **File Name**

The name to be used for the downloaded file.

- **Data Format**

The way in which the data fields are to be formatted. Possible options are:

- **Raw Data in Base Units**

The data will be exported as maintained internally within Tankvision Professional.

- **Raw Data**

The data will be exported using the current units (see Dimensions) but with no restriction on the number of decimal places.

- **Formatted Data**

The data will be exported as currently displayed on the screen.

- **Export Headers**

Indicates whether the column headers are to be exported as the first row in the export file.

- **Separator**

The character to be used to separate fields.

Clicking on the **Submit** button will cause a file to be downloaded containing the exported data in the specified format. To exit without exporting the data, click away from the popup or press the **Esc** key.

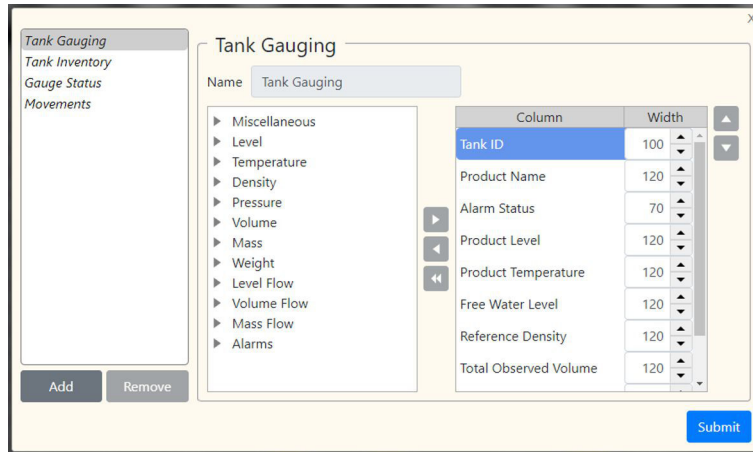

### 7.2.4 Maintaining Views

It is possible to create new custom views to meet specific requirements. To create a new view, or alter existing views, click on the **Maintain Views** button. A popup will be displayed allowing the views to be maintained:



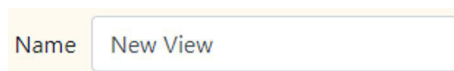

To create a new view, click the **Add** button. To remove an existing view, select the view from the list of views and then click the **Remove** button. To edit a view, select the view from the list of views and the view details will be displayed on the right hand part of the popup.

**i** Editing of built-in views is very restricted. A built-in view cannot be removed, renamed, or have the included fields changed, except to amend the width of individual fields.

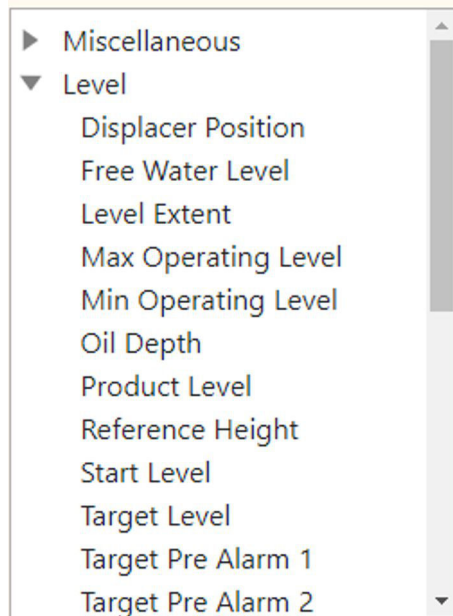
The view details group has three main parts.

The first part is the name of the view:

The second part is the list of fields that are available to be added to the view:

Where an entry can be expanded, there is an arrow ► next to the name. These entries are containers for groups of related fields and cannot be added directly to the view themselves. When the entry is expanded, the arrow will change ▼ to indicate that the fields can be hidden. To expand or collapse the entry, click on the arrow. To add a field to the currently selected view, click on the name of the field in the list and then click on the add button. The field will be added to the end of the list of fields currently in the view.

The third part is the list of fields that are currently in the view:

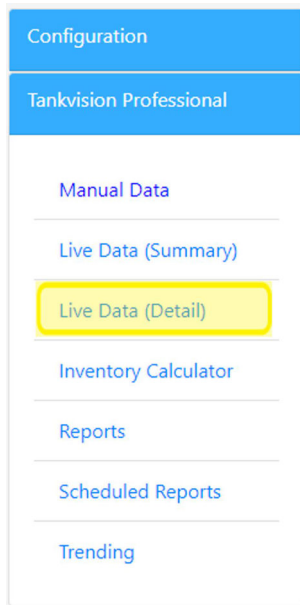

The width of individual columns in the view can be amended by changing the value for the field in the Width column. It is also possible to change the order in which the fields appear in the view. To move a field to the left, select the field and then click the **up** button. Conversely, to move a field to the right, select the field and then click the **down** button. The order of the fields in the list (top to bottom) reflect the order of the fields in the view (left to right).

To remove a field from the currently selected view, click on the field and then click the **remove** button . To remove all fields from the currently selected view, click the **remove all** button .

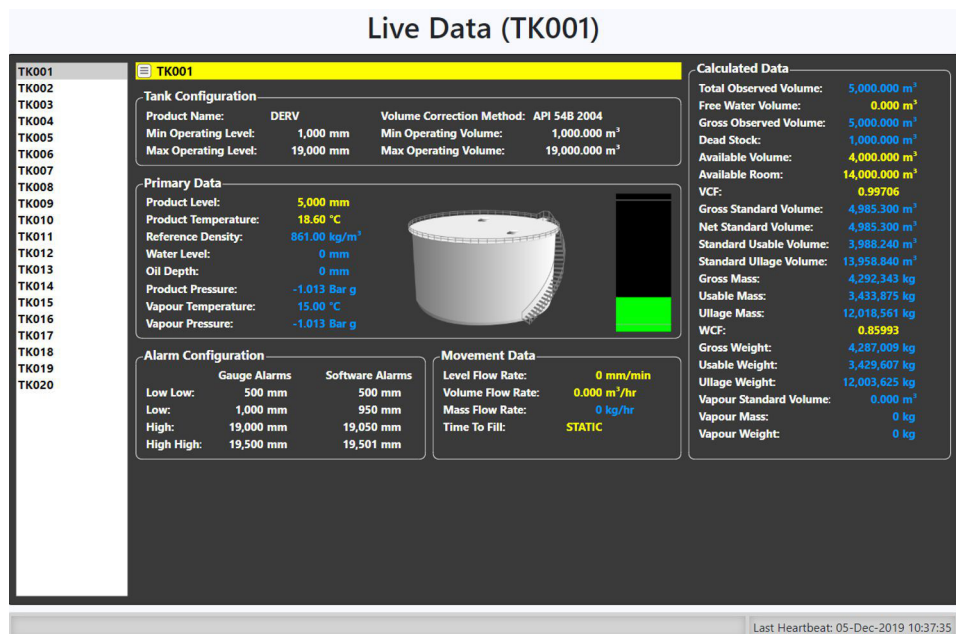

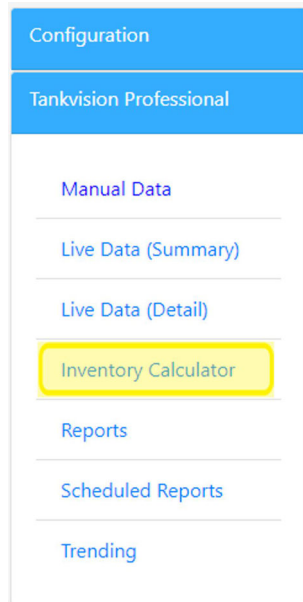

The tank calculator is used to evaluate what-if-scenarios for a tank. The inventory figures for a given set of input conditions can be calculated from the entered parameters. 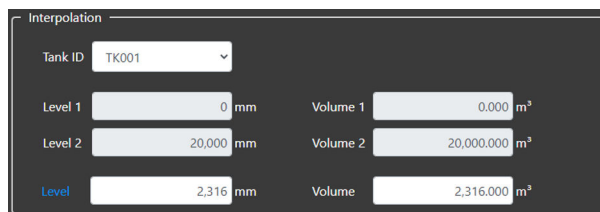

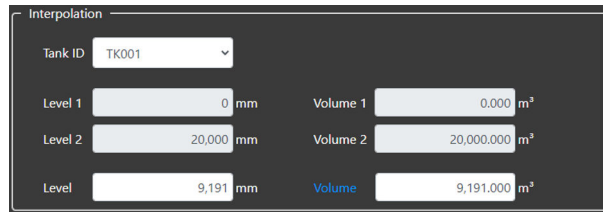

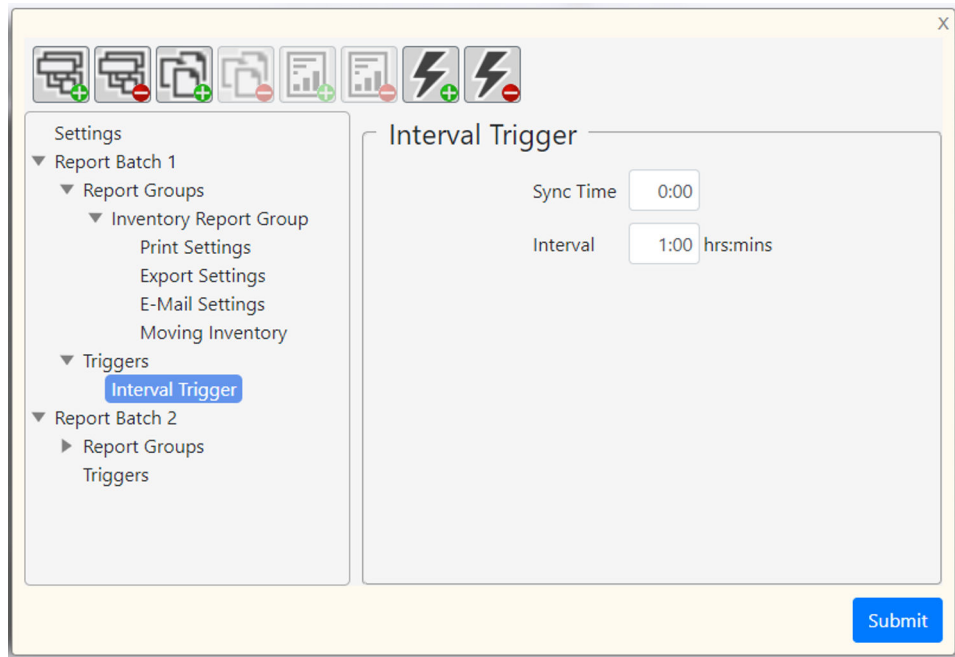

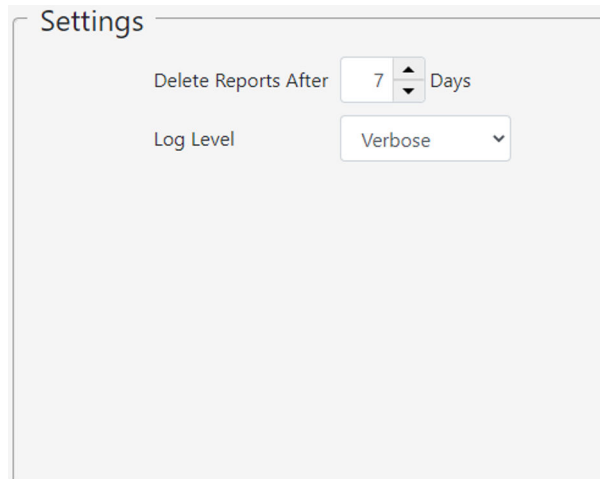

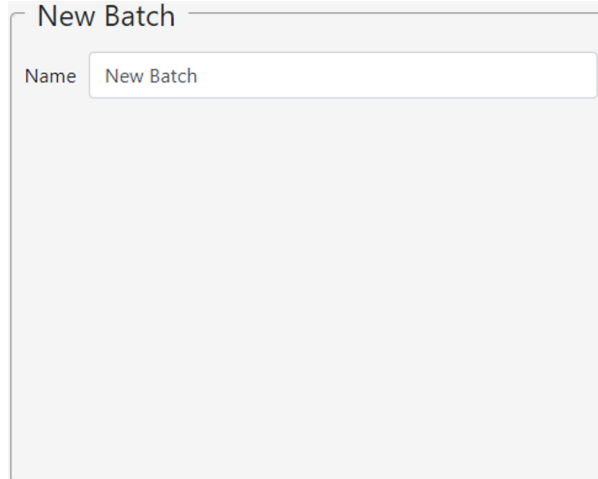

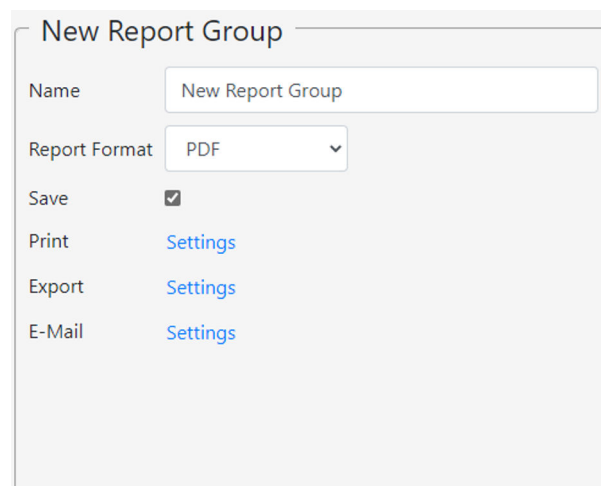

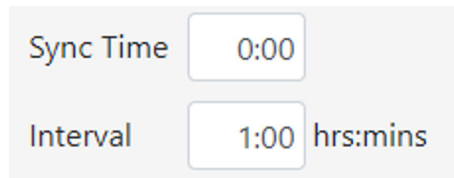

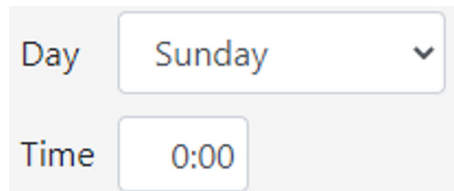

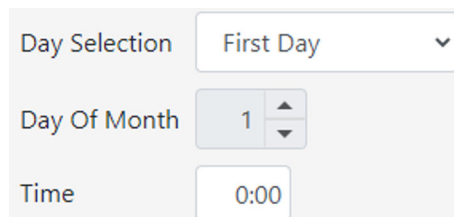

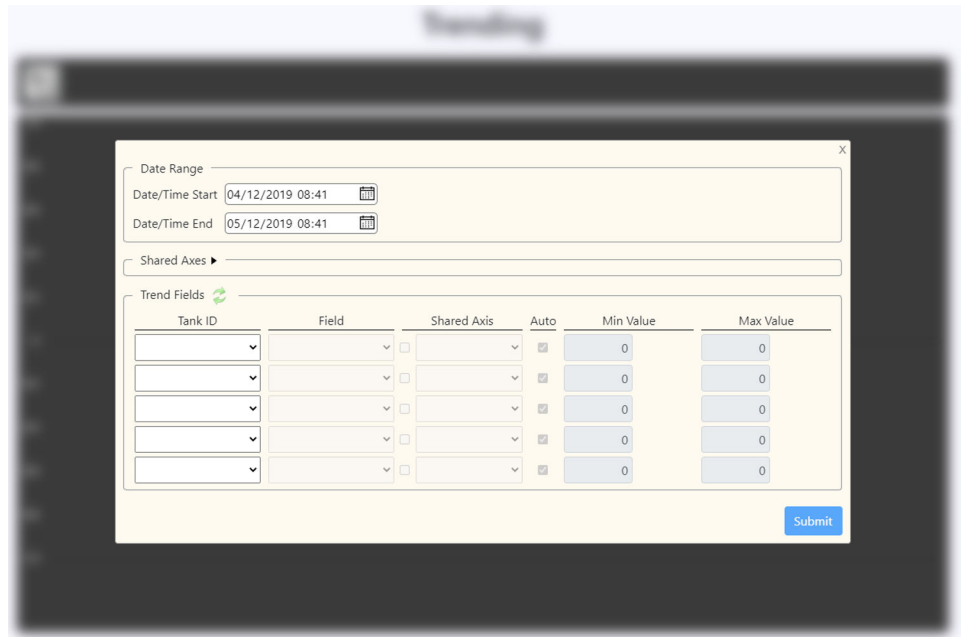

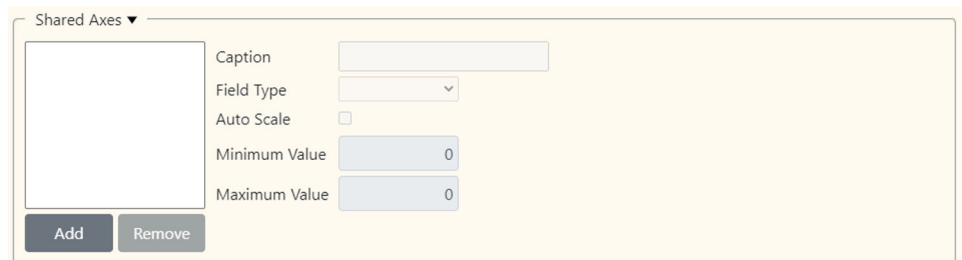
#### Date Range

The data range fields are used to define the period of time for which the trend data is required.

- **Date/Time Start**  
The date/time at which the trend should start.
- **Date/Time End**  
The date/time at which the trend should end.

#### Shared Axes

The shared axes fields are used to define axes which can be used to display multiple trend fields. This means that the fields will share common min/max values and scaling allowing for easier comparison of values. To expand the shared axes region to display the entry fields click the **arrow** ►. The shared axes configuration fields will then be displayed:

Indicates if the axis is to auto scale. If this is ticked, the minimum and maximum values for the axis are calculated from the data points in any trend fields that use this axis. Otherwise the minimum and maximum values must be explicitly entered.


- **Minimum Value**

The minimum value that can be displayed for data points in any trend fields that use this axis. Can only be entered if the axis is not auto-scaled.

- **Maximum Value**

The maximum value that can be displayed for data points in any trend fields that use this axis. Can only be entered if the axis is not auto-scaled.

### Trend Fields

Up to 5 fields can be chosen to be displayed on the trend graph. If the date/time start and/or date/time end for the trend has been changed then the list of tanks and the list of fields may not accurately reflect the tank fields that are available for that date range. To update the list of tanks and list of fields to reflect the data available for the current date range click the **refresh** image . Each trend field has the following configuration:

- **Tank ID**

The tank for which data is to be displayed. If no tank is selected, then no data is displayed.

- **Field**

The field for the tank for which data is to be displayed.

- **Shared Axis**

Indicates the shared axis to be used when plotting the data points for the field. This can only be selected if a shared axis of the correct data type has been configured.

- **Auto**

Indicates if auto-scaling is to be used for this field. This can only be configured if a shared axis is not being used.

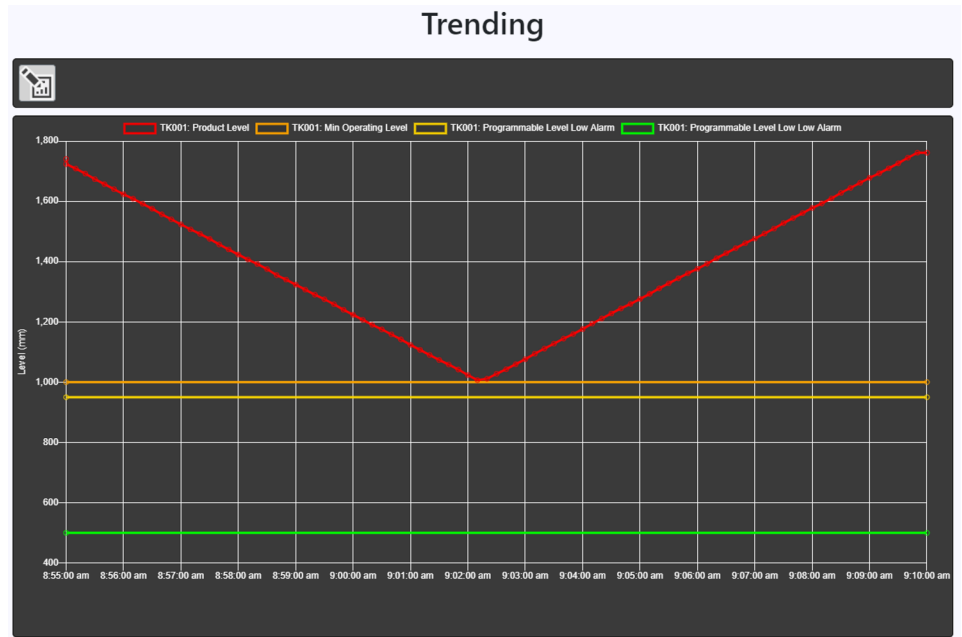
- **Min Value**

The minimum value that can be displayed for data points for the field. This can only be entered if the field is not using a shared axis and is not auto-scaled.

- **Max Value**

The maximum value that can be displayed for data points for the field. This can only be entered if the field is not using a shared axis and is not auto-scaled.
