#### 1.1 Document function

This manual is a Special Documentation; it does not replace the Operating Instructions pertaining to the device. It serves as a reference for using the Web server integrated in the measuring device.

## 1.3 Target group

The document is aimed at specialists who work with the device over the entire life cycle and perform specific configurations.

## 1.4 Using this document

This Special Documentation serves as a reference for using the Web server integrated in the measuring device. It does not replace the Operating Instructions pertaining to the device.

This Special Documentation contains a range of information, including:

- Prerequisites for use on the computer and measuring device
- Connecting the computer via the service interface and Ethernet-based fieldbus
- Configuration of the communication interface
- Establishing a connection
- Diagnostics and troubleshooting

#### 1.4.1 Device documentation

The Technical Documentation for the measuring device is available:

- On the CD-ROM supplied with the measuring device (depending on the device version, the CD-ROM might not be part of the delivery!)
- Via the W@M Device Viewer: enter the serial number from the nameplate (www.endress.com/deviceviewer)
- Via the *Endress+Hauser Operations App*: enter the serial number from the nameplate or scan the 2-D matrix code (QR code) on the nameplate.
- Technical documentation can also be downloaded from the Download Area of the Endress+Hauser web site: www.endress.com → Download. However this technical documentation applies to a particular instrument family and is not assigned to a specific measuring device.

## 2 Basic safety instructions

#### 2.1 Requirements for personnel

The personnel for installation, commissioning, diagnostics and maintenance must meet the following requirements:

- ► Trained, qualified specialists must have a relevant qualification for this specific function and task
- ► Are authorized by the plant owner/operator
- ► Are familiar with federal/national regulations
- ▶ Before beginning work, the specialist staff must have read and understood the instructions in the manuals and supplementary documentation as well as in the certificates (depending on the application)
- ▶ Follow instructions and comply with basic conditions

The operating personnel must meet the following requirements:

- ► Are instructed and authorized according to the requirements of the task by the facility's owner-operator
- ► Follow the instructions in this manual

## 2.2 Designated use

The designated use of the measuring device is described in the Operating Instructions pertaining to the device  $\rightarrow \triangleq 5$ .

## 2.3 Workplace safety

For work on and with the device:

Wear the required personal protective equipment according to federal/national regulations.

If working on and with the device with wet hands:

▶ It is recommended to wear gloves on account of the higher risk of electric shock.

## 2.4 Operational safety

#### 3.1 Measuring devices with an integrated Web server

A Web server is integrated in the following Proline flowmeters:

- Promass 100
- Promag 100
- Promag 400


Different communication protocols are available depending on the device version:

- HART
- PROFIBUS DP
- EtherNet/IP
- Measuring devices with Modbus RS485 protocol do not have an integrated Web

#### 3.2 **Integrated Web server**

Communication can be established between the measuring device (Web server) and a computer (client) using the integrated web server of the measuring device. Once communication has been established, the measuring device can be operated and configured via the Web browser on the computer. Furthermore the measuring device data can be managed and the network parameters can be configured.

#### 3.2.1 Operating options



- 1 Proline flowmeter with integrated Web server
- Local operation via display module (Promag 400 only) 2
- 3 Computer with Web browser (e.g. Internet Explorer) or operating tool (e.g. FieldCare, AMS Device Manager, SIMATIC PDM)
- Automation system (e.g. PLC)

#### Basic procedure

#### Establishing a connection to the integrated Web server

- 2. Check the settings on the measuring device and change them if necessary  $\rightarrow = 17$ .
- 3. Connect the measuring device to the computer  $\rightarrow \triangleq 19$ .
- 4. Establish a connection to the Web server  $\rightarrow \triangleq 24$ .
- 5. Start the Web browser and access the operating menu  $\rightarrow \cong 26$ .
  - The measuring device can be operated via the Web server.

## 3.3 IP address

The IP address of the measuring device is required to establish communication between the measuring device (Web server) and a computer (client). Depending on the communication protocol of the measuring device, the hardware and the software settings there are different ways of assigning or specifying the IP address.



All the hardware components available and their functions for the measuring device are described on an adhesive label on the electronics board.





## 4.1 Hardware

Interface	The computer must have an RJ45 interface.	
Connecting cable	Standard Ethernet cable with RJ45 connector.	
Screen	Recommended size: ≥12" (depends on the screen resolution)	
	Web server operation is not optimized for touch screens!


## 4.3 Configuring the computer



#### 4.3.1 Configuring IP settings for Windows

- To configure the IP settings, appropriate user rights (e.g. administrator rights) are required for the computer.
  - Before configuring the IP settings, close all the windows of the Web browser.
- 1. Click Start (Windows icon).
  - ► The Start menu appears.
- 2. In the Start menu, select *Control Panel*.
  - This opens a new window with the control panel elements.



- 3. Enter the term "adapter" in the search field.
  - └ The *Network and Sharing Center* is listed in the search results.
- 4. Select the *Network Connections* option under *Network and Sharing Center*.
  - This opens a new window with the network connections.




5. In this window, select the Local Area Connection (LAN).



6. Right-click to open the picklist and select *Properties*.

- 7. Select the *Internet Protocol Version 4 (TCP/IPv4)* item.
- Click the *Properties* button.
  - ► The Internet Protocol Version 4 (TCP/IPv4) Properties window opens.



9. In the *General* tab, select the *Use the Following IP Address* option.

10. Enter the IP address, subnet mask and default gateway as indicated in the following table and then click *Ok* to confirm.

The standard settings correspond to those for private networks. In the case of Ethernet-based networks, the settings can deviate from these standard settings and must be changed if necessary.


#### 4.3.2 Changing the proxy server settings

To establish communication, the proxy server setting *Use a Proxy Server for Your LAN* must be deselected for the Web browser.

To change the proxy server setting, appropriate user rights (e.g. administrator rights) are required for the computer.


Changing the proxy server settings taking Internet Explorer as the sample browser

- 1. Open the Web browser.
- 2. In the *Options* menu, select the *Internet Options* item.
  - ► This opens a new window with the Internet options.



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- 3. Select the *Connections* tab.
- 4. Under Local Area Network Settings click the LAN Settings button.
  - └ This opens a new window with the *Local Area Network Settings*.



5. Deselect the *Use a Proxy Server for Your LAN* checkbox and then click *Ok* to confirm.

## 5 Prerequisites: measuring device

## 5.1 Enabling the Web server

The Web server must be enabled in the measuring device (factory setting: Web server enabled).

If the Web server is disabled, it can be enabled again via the **Web server functionality** parameter. To do so, users can choose from the following operation options:

- Local display (Promag 400)
- Operating tool, e.g. FieldCare, AMS Device Manager, SIMATIC PDM (all measuring devices)

## 5.2 Determining the IP address of the measuring device

The IP address of the measuring device is required to establish communication between the measuring device (Web server) and a computer (client). The IP address used depends on the measuring device's communication protocol and the DIP switch settings  $\rightarrow \stackrel{\triangle}{=} 9$ .

#### 5.2.1 Measuring devices with PROFIBUS DP and HART protocol

Measuring devices with PROFIBUS DP and HART protocol have a fixed standard IP address, namely 192.168.1.212. This can be entered in the Web browser on the computer to establish communication.

#### 5.2.2 Measuring devices with EtherNet/IP protocol

The IP address can be assigned to the measuring device in a variety of ways:

- Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP), factory setting:
   The IP address is automatically assigned to the measuring device by the automation system (DHCP server).
- Hardware addressing:
  - The IP address is set via DIP switches  $\rightarrow \implies 31$
- Software addressing:
  - The IP address is entered via the IP address parameter  $\rightarrow \implies 32$

## 6 Connecting the computer to the measuring device

The measuring device can be connected to the computer via:

- The service interface (CDI-RJ45)
- Ethernet-based fieldbuses (only measuring devices with EtherNet/IP protocol)

## 6.1 The service interface (CDI-RJ45)

#### NOTICE

#### Risk of electric shock! Components carry dangerous voltages!

- ▶ Never open the measuring device while it is connected to the supply voltage.
- The information and safety instructions in the Operating Instructions pertaining to the measuring device must always be observed  $\Rightarrow \triangleq 5$ .

#### Promass 100 and Promag 100


- 1. Depending on the housing version, loosen the securing clamp or fixing screw of the housing cover.
- 2. Depending on the housing version, unscrew or open the housing cover.
- 3. Connect the computer to the RJ45 connector via the standard Ethernet connecting cable.
  - The location of the connection socket depends on the measuring device and the communication protocol: see the following sections.

#### Promag 400

- 1. Loosen the 4 fixing screws on the housing cover.
- 2. Open the housing cover.
- 3. Connect the computer to the RJ45 connector via the standard Ethernet connecting cable.
  - The location of the connection socket depends on the measuring device and the communication protocol: see the following sections.







The IP address can be assigned to the measuring device in a variety of ways:

- Hardware addressing:

The IP address is set via DIP switches  $\rightarrow \implies 31$ 


- Software addressing:





## 6.2 Ethernet-based fieldbus

Only available for measuring devices with EtherNet/IP protocol.

If the IP address of the measuring device is assigned via hardware or software addressing, the network connection can be established directly via the Ethernet network.

The measuring device works with the Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP) on leaving the factory, i.e. the IP address of the measuring device is automatically assigned by the automation system (DHCP server). To establish a network connection via the service interface (CDI-RJ45), the "Default Ethernet Network Settings" DIP switch must be set to ON. The measuring device then has the fixed IP address: 192.168.1.212. This address can now be used to establish the network connection  $\rightarrow \ \cong \ 21$ .

## 7 Establishing a connection to the Web server

## 7.1 Prerequisites

The IP settings in the measuring device and computer must match before a connection can be established successfully. In particular this concerns the IP addressing and Web browser settings.

The following conditions must be met to connect:

- The Web server of the measuring device is enabled  $\rightarrow \triangleq 17$ .
- The IP address of the measuring device is known  $\rightarrow$   $\blacksquare$  17.
- The computer being used meets hardware and software requirements  $\rightarrow$   $\blacksquare$  12.
- The measuring device and computer are connected to one another via the connecting cable  $\rightarrow$   $\stackrel{ riangle}{=}$  19 or
  - directly via the Ethernet network  $\rightarrow \triangleq 23$ .
- The measuring device is switched on.
- Only the active network connections to the measuring device should be used. Switch off all other network connections such as WLAN for example.

## 7.2 Starting the Web browser




## 8.1 Logging on

#### 8.2.2 Structure of the operating menu

The structure of the Web server operating menu corresponds to that of other operating tools, such as the local display, FieldCare etc.

## 8.3 Logging out

- Before logging out, perform a data backup via the **Data Management** function (upload configuration from measuring device) if necessary.
- 1. Select the **Logout** entry in the function row.

- 3. Reset modified settings for the Internet protocol (TCP/IP).

## 9.4 Checking the network connection

The network connection between the computer and measuring device can be checked using the "ping" utility of the Internet Control Message Protocol (ICMP).

- The "ping" utility sends ICMP(v6) "echo request" packets (ping, ICMP packet type 8 (0x08)) to the target address of the measuring device. According to the protocol specification, the measuring device must send back a response: ICMP "echo reply" (pong, ICMP packet type 0 (0x00)).
- 1. Click Start (Windows icon).
  - ► The startup screen including the search field opens.
- 2. In the search field, enter "cmd" (command).
  - ► A link to "cmd.exe" is displayed in the results field.
- 3. Select "cmd.exe".
  - ► A new command window opens.
- 4. Enter ping and the IP address, e.g.: ping 192.168.1.212
  - ► The network connection status is displayed.
- Depending on the operating system used, or the version of the operating system, other tools can also be used, such as Powershell.exe, prompt etc.

If the measuring device cannot be reached, the router responsible will send back the message "Network unreachable" or "Host unreachable".





## 11.2 DIP switch for "Default Ethernet Network Settings":

## Measuring device receives IP address via Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP)

The measuring device works with the Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP) on leaving the factory, i.e. the IP address of the measuring device is automatically assigned by the automation system (DHCP server).

To establish a network connection via the service interface (CDI-RJ45), the "Default Ethernet Network Settings" DIP switch must be set to *ON*. The measuring device then has the fixed IP address: 192.168.1.212. This address can now be used to establish the network connection.

The original IP address that was automatically assigned by the DHCP server is no longer used.
