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1 Document information

1.1 Document function

This manual is a Special Documentation; it does not replace the Operating Instructions pertaining to the device. It serves as a reference for using the Web server integrated in the measuring device.

1.2 Target group

The document is aimed at specialists who work with the device over the entire life cycle and perform specific configurations.

1.3 Using this document

1.3.1 Information on the document structure

This Special Documentation contains a range of information, including:

- Prerequisites for use on the computer and measuring device
- Connection of the computer via the service interface or Ethernet-based fieldbus
- Configuration of the communication interface
- Establishing a connection
- Diagnostics and troubleshooting

The information and safety instructions in the Operating Instructions pertaining to the measuring device must always be observed $\rightarrow \cong 4$.

1.3.2 Device documentation

The Technical Documentation for the measuring device is available:

- On the CD-ROM supplied with the measuring device (depending on the device version, the CD-ROM might not be part of the delivery!)
- Via the *W@M Device Viewer*: enter the serial number from the nameplate (www.endress.com/deviceviewer)
- Via the *Endress+Hauser Operations App*: enter the serial number from the nameplate or scan the 2-D matrix code (QR code) on the nameplate.

Technical documentation can also be downloaded from the Download Area of the Endress+Hauser web site: www.endress.com → Download. However this technical documentation applies to a particular instrument family and is not assigned to a specific measuring device.

2 Basic safety instructions

2.1 Requirements for personnel

Personnel involved in installation, commissioning, diagnostics and maintenance must meet the following requirements:

- Trained, qualified specialists must have a relevant qualification for this specific function and task
- Are authorized by the plant owner/operator
- Are familiar with federal/national regulations
- Before starting work, read and understand the instructions in the manual and supplementary documentation as well as the certificates (depending on the application)
- ► Follow instructions and comply with basic conditions

Operating personnel must meet the following requirements:

- Be instructed and authorized by the plant operator with regard to the requirements of the task
- ► Follow the instructions in this manual

2.2 Designated use

The designated use of the measuring device is described in the Operating Instructions pertaining to the device $\rightarrow \cong 4$.

2.3 Occupational safety

For work on and with the device:

• Wear the required personal protective equipment according to federal/national regulations.

If working on and with the device with wet hands:

► It is recommended to wear gloves on account of the higher risk of electric shock.

2.4 Operational safety

Risk of injury!

- Operate the device in proper technical condition and fail-safe condition only.
- The operator is responsible for interference-free operation of the device.

Modifications to the device

Unauthorized modifications to the device are not permitted and can lead to unforeseeable dangers.

This device is designed in accordance with good engineering practice to meet state-of-theart safety requirements, has been tested, and left the factory in a condition in which it is safe to operate.

It meets general safety standards and legal requirements. It also complies with the EC directives listed in the device-specific EC Declaration of Conformity. Endress+Hauser confirms this by affixing the CE mark to the device.

2.6 IT security

We only provide a warranty if the device is installed and used as described in the Operating Instructions. The device is equipped with security mechanisms to protect it against any inadvertent changes to the device settings.

IT security measures in line with operators' security standards and designed to provide additional protection for the device and device data transfer must be implemented by the operators themselves.

3 Product features and availability

3.1 Product features


Thanks to the integrated Web server, the device can be operated and configured via a Web browser and via a service interface (CDI-RJ45) . In addition to the measured values, status information on the device is also displayed and allows the user to monitor the status of the device. Furthermore the device data can be managed and the network parameters can be configured.

3.2 Availability

The integrated Web server is a standard feature. It does not need to be ordered for the device ex works as it is provided as standard when the device is delivered to the customer. No particular measures are required to put the feature into operation.

3.3 Identification in the measuring device







4.2.3 Navigation area

If a function is selected in the function bar, the submenus of the function open in the navigation area. The user can now navigate through the menu structure.

4.2.4 Working area

Depending on the selected function and the related submenus, various actions can be performed in this area:

- Configuring parameters
- Reading measured values
- Calling up help text
- Starting an upload/download

4.3 Logging out

Before logging out, perform a data backup via the **Data management** function (upload configuration from device) if necessary.

- 1. Select the **Logout** entry in the function row.
- 2. Close the Web browser.
- 3. If no longer needed:

Reset modified properties of the Internet protocol (TCP/IP) $\rightarrow \cong$ 22.

If communication with the Web server was established via the default IP address 192.168.1.212, DIP switch No. 10 must be reset (from $ON \rightarrow OFF$). Afterwards, the IP address of the device is active again for network communication.



 Unscrew or open the housing cover and disconnect the local display from the main electronics module where necessary.

- 3. Set the desired IP address using the corresponding DIP switches on the I/O electronics module.
 - └ Hardware addressing with the configured IP address is enabled after 10 s.
- 4. Reverse the removal procedure to reassemble the transmitter.

NOTICE

When the IP address is changed via hardware addressing, the new IP address is used after 10 seconds.

Communication between the measuring device and computer is terminated.

 Communication between the measuring device and computer must be reestablished with the modified IP address.

Software addressing

When delivered, the measuring device has the following factory settings:

IP address	192.168.1.212
Subnet mask	255.255.255.0
Default gateway	192.168.1.212

• Software addressing is locked when hardware addressing is enabled.

- The "Write protection" DIP switch must be disabled (set to OFF).
- If a switch is made to hardware addressing, the address configured via software addressing is retained for the first 9 places (the first three octets).

NOTICE

When the IP address is changed via software addressing, the new IP address is used as soon as it is confirmed.

- Communication between the measuring device and computer is terminated.
- Communication between the measuring device and computer must be reestablished with the modified IP address.

The IP address can be read out and configured in the **Configuration** submenu.

4.4.2 DIP switch for "Default Ethernet Network Settings"

Use cases

The "Default Ethernet Network Settings" DIP switch can be used in the following applications.

Measuring device receives IP address via Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP)

The device is configured at the factory to work with the Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP), i.e. the IP address of the measuring device is automatically assigned by the automation system (DHCP server).

- ► For establishing a network connection via the service interface (CDI-RJ45):
 - Set the "Default Ethernet Network Settings" DIP switch to **On**.
 - ← The measuring device then has the fixed IP address: 192.168.1.212. This address can now be used to establish the network connection. The original IP address automatically assigned by the DHCP server is no longer used.

IP address currently used is not known

If the IP address of the measuring device is assigned via hardware or software addressing and this IP address is not known, the network connection can be established via the service interface (CDI-RJ45).

- ► For establishing a network connection via the service interface (CDI-RJ45): Set the "Default Ethernet Network Settings" DIP switch to **ON**.
 - └ The measuring device then has the fixed IP address: 192.168.1.212. This address can now be used to establish the network connection. The original IP address that was set via hardware addressing (DIP switch) or software addressing is no longer used.


If the IP address of the measuring device is assigned via hardware or software addressing and the IP address is known, the network connection can also be established directly via the Ethernet network $\rightarrow \cong 22$.

The IP address set via software addressing is to be changed via the Web server

If the IP address of the measuring device is assigned via software addressing and this IP address is to be changed via the Web server, the network connection must be established via the service interface (CDI-RJ45).

- ► For establishing a network connection via the service interface (CDI-RJ45): Set the "Default Ethernet Network Settings" DIP switch to ON.
 - ← The measuring device then has the fixed IP address: 192.168.1.212. This address can now be used to establish the network connection.

The original IP address that was set via software addressing is no longer used.



NOTICE

If the "Default Ethernet Network Settings" DIP switch is used, the IP address known to the network/automation system is no longer used.

The measuring device is disconnected from the network and the automation system can no longer talk to it.


- ► After finishing the measuring device configuration, the "Default Ethernet Network Settings" DIP switch must be disabled again (**OFF**).
- The measuring device must be restarted so that the device once again uses the original IP address that was automatically assigned by the automation system (DHCP server) or set via hardware addressing (DIP switch) or software addressing (IP address parameter).
- Electrical connection of the measuring device with a computer via the service interface (CDI-RJ45) $\rightarrow \cong 22$

1. Depending on the housing version:

Release the securing clamp or securing screw of the housing cover.

- Depending on the housing version:
 Unscrew or open the housing cover and disconnect the local display from the main electronics module where necessary.
- 3. Connect the measuring device and computer via the CDI-RJ45 service interface $\rightarrow \cong 22$
- 4. At the measuring device:

Set the DIP switch for "Default IP Address 192.168.1.212" from **OFF** to **ON**.

- 5. Restart the measuring device.
 - └ The measuring device now uses the following settings:
 - IP address: 192.168.1.212
 - Subnet mask: 255.255.255.0
 - Default gateway: 192.168.1.212

Note!

All the parameters, such as the IP address, nevertheless retain their original values and are visible and modifiable in the operating menu.

6. On the computer: enter the IP address in the address field of the Web browser.

└ ► Communication between the measuring device and computer is established.

Once you have finished configuring the measuring device, the "Default Ethernet Network Settings" DIP switch must be disabled again (OFF) and the measuring device must be restarted. After restarting, the measuring device uses the IP address originally configured and the measuring device is reconnected to the network.

5 Commissioning

Establishing a connection to the integrated Web server

- **1.** Configure the computer $\rightarrow \triangleq 16 \rightarrow \triangleq 16$.
- **2.** Check the settings on the measuring device and change them if necessary $\rightarrow \cong 21$.
- **3.** Connect the measuring device to the computer $\rightarrow \cong 22$.
- 4. Establish a connection to the Web server $\rightarrow \cong 24$.
- 5. Start the Web browser and access the operating menu →
 ⁽¹⁾ 25.

 ⁽¹⁾ The measuring device can be operated via the Web server.





Standard settings for IP address, subnet mask and default gateway

The standard settings correspond to those for private networks. In the case of Ethernet-based networks, the settings can deviate from these standard settings and must be changed if necessary.

Changing the proxy server settings

To establish communication, the proxy server setting *Use a Proxy Server for Your LAN* must be deselected for the Web browser.

To change the proxy server setting, appropriate user rights (e.g. administrator rights) are required for the computer.

5.2 Prerequisites - measuring device

5.2.1 Enabling the Web server

The Web server must be enabled in the measuring device (factory setting).

If the Web server is disabled it be enabled again via the **Web server functionality** parameter ($\rightarrow \textcircled{28}$). To do so, users can choose from the following operation options: Operating tool e.g. FieldCare, DeviceCare, AMS Device Manager , SIMATIC PDM

5.2.2 Determining the IP address of the measuring device

The IP address of the measuring device is required to establish communication between the measuring device (Web server) and a computer (client). The IP address used depends on the setting of the DIP switches or on the system settings.

The IP address can be assigned to the measuring device in a variety of ways:

- Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP), factory setting:
- The IP address is automatically assigned to the measuring device by the automation system (DHCP server).
- Hardware addressing:
 - The IP address is set via DIP switches
- Software addressing: The IP address is entered via the IP address parameter (→ ≅ 28) → ≅ 12
 DIP switch for "Default Ethernet Network Settings":
- For establishing the network connection via the service interface (CDI-RJ45). The fixed IP address 192.168.1.212 is used .

The measuring device can be connected to the computer via:

- Service interface (CDI-RJ45)
- Ethernet-based fieldbuses

5.3.1 Via service interface (CDI-RJ45)

Preparing the measuring device

- Depending on the housing version: Release the securing clamp or securing screw of the housing cover.
- 2. Depending on the housing version: Unscrew or open the housing cover.
- **3.** The location of the connection socket depends on the measuring device and the communication protocol:

Connect the computer to the RJ45 connector via the standard Ethernet connecting cable $\rightarrow \cong 8$.

Configuring the Internet protocol of the computer

- Hardware addressing:
- The IP address is set via DIP switches $\rightarrow \square 11$
- Software addressing:
- The IP address is entered via the **IP address** parameter ($\rightarrow \square 28$) $\rightarrow \square 12$
- DIP switch for "Default Ethernet Network Settings":

To establish the network connection via the service interface (CDI-RJ45): the fixed IP address 192.168.1.212 is used $\rightarrow \cong$ 13.

The measuring device works with the Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP), on leaving the factory, i.e. the IP address of the measuring device is automatically assigned by the automation system (DHCP server).

To establish a network connection via the service interface (CDI-RJ45): the "Default Ethernet network settings" DIP switch must be set to **ON**. The measuring device then has the fixed IP address: 192.168.1.212. This address can now be used to establish the network connection.

If the IP address of the measuring device is assigned via hardware or software addressing and the IP address is known, the network connection can also be established directly via the Ethernet network $\rightarrow \cong 22$.

- 1. Switch on the measuring device.
- **2.** Connect to the computer using a cable $\rightarrow \cong 8$.
- 3. If a 2nd network card is not used, close all the applications on the notebook.
 - └→ Applications requiring Internet or a network, such as e-mail, SAP applications, Internet or Windows Explorer.
- 4. Close any open Internet browsers.


5. Configure the properties of the Internet protocol (TCP/IP) as defined in the table:

5.3.2 Via Ethernet-based fieldbus

If the IP address of the measuring device is assigned via hardware or software addressing, the network connection can be established directly via the Ethernet network.

The device is configured at the factory to work with the Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP), i.e. the IP address of the measuring device is automatically assigned by the automation system (DHCP server). To establish a network connection via the service interface (CDI-RJ45): the "Default Ethernet network settings" DIP switch must be set to **ON**. The measuring device then has the fixed IP address: 192.168.1.212. This address can now be used to establish the network connection $\rightarrow \cong 22$.

5.4 Establishing a connection to the Web server

5.4.1 Prerequisites

The IP settings in the measuring device and computer must match before a connection can be established successfully. In particular this concerns the IP addressing and Web browser settings.

The following conditions must be met to connect:

- The Web server of the measuring device is enabled $\rightarrow \cong 21$.
- The IP address of the measuring device is known $\rightarrow \square 21$.
- The computer used meets the requirements for hardware and software $\rightarrow \square$ 16.
- The measuring device and computer are connected to one another $\rightarrow \square 22$
- The measuring device is switched on.

5.4.2 Starting the Web browser

If JavaScript cannot be enabled:

enter http://XXX.XXX.XXX/basic.html in the address line of the Web browser, e.g. http://192.168.1.212/basic.html. A fully functional but simplified version of the operating menu structure starts in the Web browser.

When installing a new firmware version: To enable correct data display, clear the temporary memory (cache) of the Web browser under **Internet options**.

Prerequisite: The IP address of the measuring device is known.

- 1. Start the Web browser on the computer.
- 2. Enter the defined device address in the address line of the Web browser. The login page appears.

Prerequisite: The IP address of the measuring device is not known.

- 1. Start the Web browser on the computer.
- 2. Switch DIP switch No. 10 to **ON**.
- 3. Restart the device.
- 4. Enter the default IP address 192.168.1.212.
 - └ The login page appears.

If a login page does not appear, or if the page is incomplete $\rightarrow \cong 29$

5.5 Setting the IP address

The IP address of the measuring device is required to establish communication between the measuring device (Web server) and a computer (client). There are various options to assign or specify the IP address depending on the hardware and software settings.



6.2 Diagnostic information in the Web browser

6.2.1 Diagnostic options

Any faults detected by the measuring device are displayed in the Web browser on the home page once the user has logged on.

Status signals


The status signals provide information on the state and reliability of the device by categorizing the cause of the diagnostic information (diagnostic event).

Symbol	Meaning
\otimes	Failure A device error has occurred. The measured value is no longer valid.
V	Function check The device is in service mode (e.g. during a simulation).
<u>?</u>	Out of specification The device is operated: Outside its technical specification limits (e.g. outside the process temperature range)

The status signals are categorized in accordance with VDI/VDE 2650 and NAMUR Recommendation NE 107.

Diagnostic information

The fault can be identified using the diagnostic information. The short text helps you by providing information about the fault.



6.2.2 Calling up remedy information

Remedy information is provided for every diagnostic event to ensure that problems can be rectified quickly. These measures are displayed in red along with the diagnostic event and the related diagnostic information.

6.3 Diagnostic information in the measuring device

6.3.1 Overview of Web server information events

Unlike a diagnostic event, an information event is displayed in the event logbook only and not in the diagnostic list.

6.4 Checking the network connection

The network connection between the computer and measuring device can be checked using the "ping" utility of the Internet Control Message Protocol (ICMP).

The "ping" utility sends ICMP(v6) "echo request" packets (ping, ICMP packet type 8 (0x08)) to the target address of the measuring device. According to the protocol specification, the measuring device must send back a response: ICMP "echo reply" (pong, ICMP packet type 0 (0x00)).

1. Click *Start* (Windows icon).

- └ The Start screen opens along with the search field.
- 2. In the search field, enter "cmd" (command).
 - ← A link to "cmd.exe" is displayed in the results field.
- 3. Select the "cmd.exe" link.
 - └ A new command window opens.

4. Enter ping and the IP address, e.g.: ping 192.168.1.212
 The network connection status is displayed.

Depending on the operating system used, or the version of the operating system, other tools can also be used, such as Powershell.exe, prompt etc.

If the measuring device cannot be reached the router responsible delivers the following response:

- "Network unreachable"
 - or
- "Host unreachable"
- **1.** Check the IP address settings $\rightarrow \cong 21$.
- **2.** Check whether the Web server is enabled $\rightarrow \cong 21$.
